Usability Test Script

Introduction

Hello (name), thank you in advance for your time to take part in this usability testing. I'm Chelsi, currently a UX designer responsible for this project. I'll be your interviewer for today's session.

Before we start, I'd like you to know the context and the specific goals for the testing today, so you'll know what to expect. I'll be asking you to try out my project app and web platform and to do a few tasks using both platforms. Open-Ended Questions

Please tell me what your initial impressions of the app. What do you like and don't like? What do you think the platform is intending to do?

Now let's move onto trying out some specific tasks using the platform.

Tasks

I'll be giving you 3 scenarios to complete. As you work through the process of how to go about it, please think out loud and tell me what your thoughts and feelings are as you navigate through to complete the tasks.

- 1. You just [downloaded the app/accessed the home page] and would like to sign up and access the home screen. Please demonstrate how you would go about doing so and what your general impression of the process itself.
- 2. The name on your profile is different than what you'd like to be shown, please show me how you would go about changing your profile name.
- 3. Lastly, you'd like to start saving for a house in the future would like to use this platform to set up a savings plan. Please show me how you would go about doing so.

Wrap-Up
